Overview

The Tactical Assessment and Threat Recognition Course teaches police officers how to rapidly establish a baseline for situations they are in and how to identify the criminal hiding within the crowd. This allows an officer to first locate a criminal and then to justify their actions using a terminology based on scientific and objective assessments.

Problem

The ability of police officers to detect and prevent criminal behavior is a trait that the public expects, and it is what makes officers effective in preventing violence. Often called a “hunch” or a “gut instinct,” observations made by officers regularly lead to arrests and sometimes the use of deadly force. These encounters bring scrutiny to law enforcement agencies. Being able to articulate the legal and scientific reasoning behind the identification of suspicious people is imperative to good policing.

Solution

Our training program is a tactical situational awareness course designed to help law enforcement and security professionals defeat criminal and terrorist networks by teaching students how to quickly and accurately assess the intentions, capabilities, and emotions of those we interact with everyday. Behavioral analysis instruction is designed to provide students with the tools and techniques to observe specific elements of nonverbal human behavior that allows them to accurately predict the future actions of individuals and groups that harbor violent intent. The tools and techniques taught in the course are combat proven in Iraq, Afghanistan and by progressive law enforcement departments across the U.S.

Benefits

By learning to read and assess the uncontrollable and universal elements of human behavior, police officers will be prepared to make intelligent decisions in situations when only a limited amount of time and information is available. After completion of this program, participants will be able to:

- Establish the baseline for situations and the environment
- Use the four pillars of observable behavior to communicate, articulate, and justify the actions to improve on-the-ground decision-making
- Understand how to observe and classify behavior, allowing police officers to quickly attain accurate and reliable information
